Call for Workshop Presentations: Enhancing the Student Experience through Work Based and Placement Learning

The conference is participatory, allowing delegates to share experiences and learn from each other. The 2010 Conference will feature a selection of sector research papers and a wide range of practitioner workshops, delivered by individuals and teams from a range of UK and international institutions.

ASET is keen to disseminate the findings and recommendations of employability, placement, work experience and work-based learning **research**, including the work of the Centres for Excellence in Teaching and Learning.

A key feature of previous ASET conferences has also been the opportunity to hear about work at a broad range of institutions, about new **initiatives** and **projects**, and of **good practice** systems – this conference will continue this strong tradition.

Conference 2010 will address the huge imperative of enhancing the student experience through work based and placement learning. Workshop presentations are invited under any placement or employability related topic, though in order to provide a framework for the conference submissions on the following themes would be especially welcomed: student voice, employer engagement, skills, reflective learning, assessment and feedback and the use of technology to support learning.

Contributions Welcome

Selection of presentations will be based on a written synopsis. The synopsis must include: (a) Presentation title; (b) Presenter/s and institution/s with a contact address, telephone number and email; (c) up to six key words; (d) Abstract (limited to 500 words) outlining the aims and objectives of the presentation, experiences covered, and issues to be addressed. A final paper should be submitted, and limited to 3000 words. Copies of slides used for the presentation element may also be submitted at the conference.

Workshop sessions will be approximately 45 minutes long and should be designed to be participatory in nature - it is envisaged that the presentation element of the workshop should be no longer than 20 minutes.

All contributions will be peer reviewed and those accepted and submitting papers will be published in the official proceedings with ISBN.

Notification of acceptance, following peer review, by **16th April 2010**

Your full paper, as detailed above, should reach ASET by **25th June 2010**
